



U.S. Figure Skating has an online course to provide training for judging moves in the field. The course focuses on the elements that were added in September 2010.

The course contains a combination of videos, written information (descriptions, diagrams and common errors for the moves covered) and questions that you will have to answer. The course begins with some general questions. It is then broken up by level and move with the questions for each move directly following the video and information for that move. You will need the ability to hear audio in order to hear the narrative that is included with each video.

You're not required to answer a minimum number of questions correctly to receive credit for taking the online course; however, if you answer more than 20% of the questions incorrectly, we strongly encourage you to review the information carefully before you judge any moves in the field tests.

We recommend that you plan at least one hour to take the course; however, you have the ability to save your progress and return to the course to finish it at a later time, so you don't have to get it all done in one sitting.

We recommend that you have the diagrams and descriptions for the new moves available when you take the course in order to minimize the need to navigate back and forth between screens. You can find these in the current U.S. Figure Skating rulebook available online at www.usfigureskatingrules.org.

Each judge who completes the course will receive 10 CEUs. CEUs will be entered into your membership record manually as soon as possible after the course is completed. Although every effort will be made to get CEUs processed within one business day after completion, please plan for up to a week for the CEUs to be entered.
