

Technical Notification 306

Re: Singles – Choreographic and Partial Choreographic Sequence (ChSq and pChSq)

(1) Calling procedure for pChSq DO readback

- DO reads pChSq1 as "Partial Choreo Confirmed" or "P Choreo Confirmed"
- DO reads pChSq as "Partial Choreo No Value" or "P Choreo No Value"
- (2) Listed jumps and spins of three revolutions or more are not allowed in the pChSq. The pChSq ends the moment a listed jump or spin of three revolutions or more is executed. These elements will be called and will occupy a box.
- (3) No identifiable sequence, or the wrong type of sequence is performed:

When pChSq/ChSq is required:

- Technical panel will only evaluate whether a pChSq/ChSq is confirmed or not.
- Technical panel will call a pChSq/ChSq No Value if there are not two different movements performed.
- Any other sequence performed will be considered connecting steps, will be ignored by the technical panel, and will NOT be called.

When StSq is required, but pChSq/ChSq is performed:

- Technical panel will call the appropriate level of a StSq (no value if the ice is not fully covered; StSqB if the ice is fully covered and no StSq level features are achieved).
- (4) Types of movements that may be included and identified in the pChSq/ChSq:

Examples of Skating Movements (bolded movements are listed in TP Handbook for ChSq)	
Spread Eagles	Butterflies
Ina Bauers	Mazurkas
Hydroblading	Inside axel takeoffs
Spirals	Eulers
Arabesques	Falling leaves
Lunges	Walleys
Pivots	Split jumps
Illusions	Ballet jumps

** this list is not inclusive of all skating movements **
other movements may be designed, included or created for the pChSq/ChSq
